STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT

School Students are expected to:

Respect

- Treat one another with dignity.
- Not bully, harass, intimidate or discriminate against any other Student, in person or online; whether at School or outside School. Students will not coerce other Students to engage in these behaviours.
- Speak and behave courteously.
- Cooperate with others.
- Resolve conflict respectfully, calmly and fairly.
- Value the respect, interests, ability, religion and culture of others.
- Take care with property – the School's, their own and that of others.
- Actively listen.
- Be honest.
- Be patient.
- Extend kindness and helpfulness to fellow Students and in the School community.

Safety

- Model and follow Ministry, School and/or class codes of conduct.
- Negotiate and resolve conflict with understanding.
- Take personal responsibility for behaviour and actions.
- Avoid dangerous behaviour and encourage others to avoid dangerous behaviour.
- Not be violent or bring weapons, illegal drugs, alcohol or tobacco into school.
- Report any acts of violence and possession of forbidden items to School supervisors.

Engagement

- Arrive at School and class on time and stay on the School premises during School hours.
- Be prepared for every lesson.
- Actively participate in learning.
- Keep School work up to date.
- Complete homework and Assessments to the best of your ability.
- Aspire and strive to achieve the highest standards of learning.
- Comply with the School's uniform policy/dress code and School Regulations.
- Only submit original work for assessments.
- Appear for all Examinations unless sick or on an absence approved by a Parent/Guardian and Teacher.

Students shall be responsible and accountable for their behaviour and conduct:

- while travelling to and from school
- while on school property
- in their interaction with peers, staff, volunteers, and guests to the school
- during any recess or lunch periods on or off School property
- while involved in School – sponsored or related activities, and
- beyond the hours of School operation, whether on or off School grounds, if the behaviour conduct detrimentally affects the reputation of the School or the Ministry.

Parents and Guardians play a vital role in managing Student behaviour. It is the Ministry's expectation that Parents and Guardians:

- be aware of School's policy and regulations and the School's expectations for Student behaviour and conduct
- work with the School to resolve Student behavioural issues when they affect their child/children
- maintain regular communication with the School
- encourage a positive attitude towards learning
- create a good learning environment at home
- monitor Student access to the internet
- attend Parent/teacher interviews and meetings with Teachers, when requested.

Grounds for disciplinary action that could lead to Suspension or Expulsion exist where a Student has demonstrated Unacceptable Student Behaviour such as:

- conduct that threatens the safety of Students and/or staff
- assaulting another Student
- bullying which means repeated and hostile or demeaning behaviour by an individual in the School community where the behaviour is intended to cause harm, fear or distress to one or more other individuals in the School community, including psychological harm or harm to an individual's reputation. Bullying behaviours may include name calling, exclusion, inappropriate language, threats, gestures, innuendos, or intimidation; in person, electronically, or online
- possession or use of weapons, illegal drugs, alcohol, or inhalants in School and on School property
- contravention of School policies and regulations related to Student harassment, smoking, Student attendance, and Student rights and responsibilities.
- theft
- use or display of improper or profane language
- wilful damage to School or other's property
- interfering with the orderly conduct of class(es) or the School
- trespassing, loitering, and causing a disturbance on or in School premises
- use of technology such as computers, cameras, cell phones, and other digital equipment for purposes that are illegal, unethical, immoral, or inappropriate
- unacceptable behaviour during sporting activities in or out of School which brings the School into disrepute, such as swearing at referees or fighting with opposing team members
- possessing or circulating inappropriate material such as pornography or graphically violent material
- any other Unacceptable Student Behaviour as outlined in Ministry policies.
